Clarity Around Uniform Expectations

I am really pleased that the children display our values of Excellence and Appreciation, through always wearing the correct school uniform. There are a couple of areas where some clarification is needed with:

Black School Jackets

- These should be worn in addition to the school jumper and not instead of, on the days of formal uniform. If it is particularly cold outside the children can wear the jacket over the jumper. The children do not need to wear the jackets inside as the classrooms are warm.

Black Leather School Shoes

- We have some children wearing black fashion shoes and even skate type shoes. Please ensure that the children wear black school shoes only.

Hair

- Hair styles must be conservative and hair longer than collar length must be tied up. If hair is across the face it must be clipped back.

In sharing this, I also want to thank families for your efforts to uphold our high standard of uniform. It is a very visible sign of the pride we have in our wonderful community school.

Staff Professional Development – OLC Vision for Learning Workshop

Last Monday the OLC teachers and Education Assistants participated in a workshop that focused on creating a consistent “**Vision for Learning**” throughout our school.

The workshop is based on the Catholic Education Western Australia's Vision for learning Framework.

As a precursor to the workshop all the staff were asked to come prepared with an answer to the question:

“If you had to name the 5 ‘elements’ or ‘practices’ that a teacher (anyone who influences learning) in Catholic education should do every day to make a difference, what would they be?”


From this point the staff worked together to form a common census and language. The 5 elements that the OLC staff developed were almost exactly the same practices as outlined in the CEWA framework.
