Champion Life

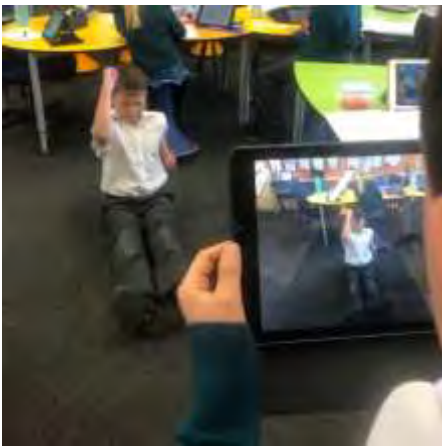
One of the new initiatives that has been sweeping through OLC classrooms is "Champion Life".

THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY: OLC'S FEAST DAY

We celebrate our school feast day on the Assumption of Mary each year, which falls next Thursday the 15th of August. On this day, we remember Mary going to heaven. We will begin with a whole school mass at the church (weather permitting; it will be held in the hall if it is raining), celebrated by our new priest Fr. Francis, at 9.30am. We would love for parents and grandparents to join us for this celebration.

Following Mass, classes will focus on the Feast of the Assumption during their classwork up until 11.45am. Please note that this is not a free dress day. The students should wear their sports uniform please. At 11.45am the annual *Mission Markets* will happen, where each class has a stall and students buy from the stalls or pay to participate in an activity. The money raised is used for Catholic Mission Australia. Compelled by the message, life and love of Jesus Christ, Catholic Mission forms Australians for mission and raises funds for mission - in Australia and around the world.

Children should bring no more than \$10.00 (senior students) or \$5.00 (junior students), preferably in coins, to spend at the markets. Please also supply your child with a reusable bag for children to take their purchases or prizes home in.

After lunch, the classes will be broken into multi-aged groups and they will participate in a rotation of activities that are a mixture of fun indoor and outdoor games and activities (fingers crossed with the weather!) Thanks to the staff for helping the classes organise this day of celebration and to our senior students who will provide the necessary support for the younger students on the day. We look forward to a fun time for all!
